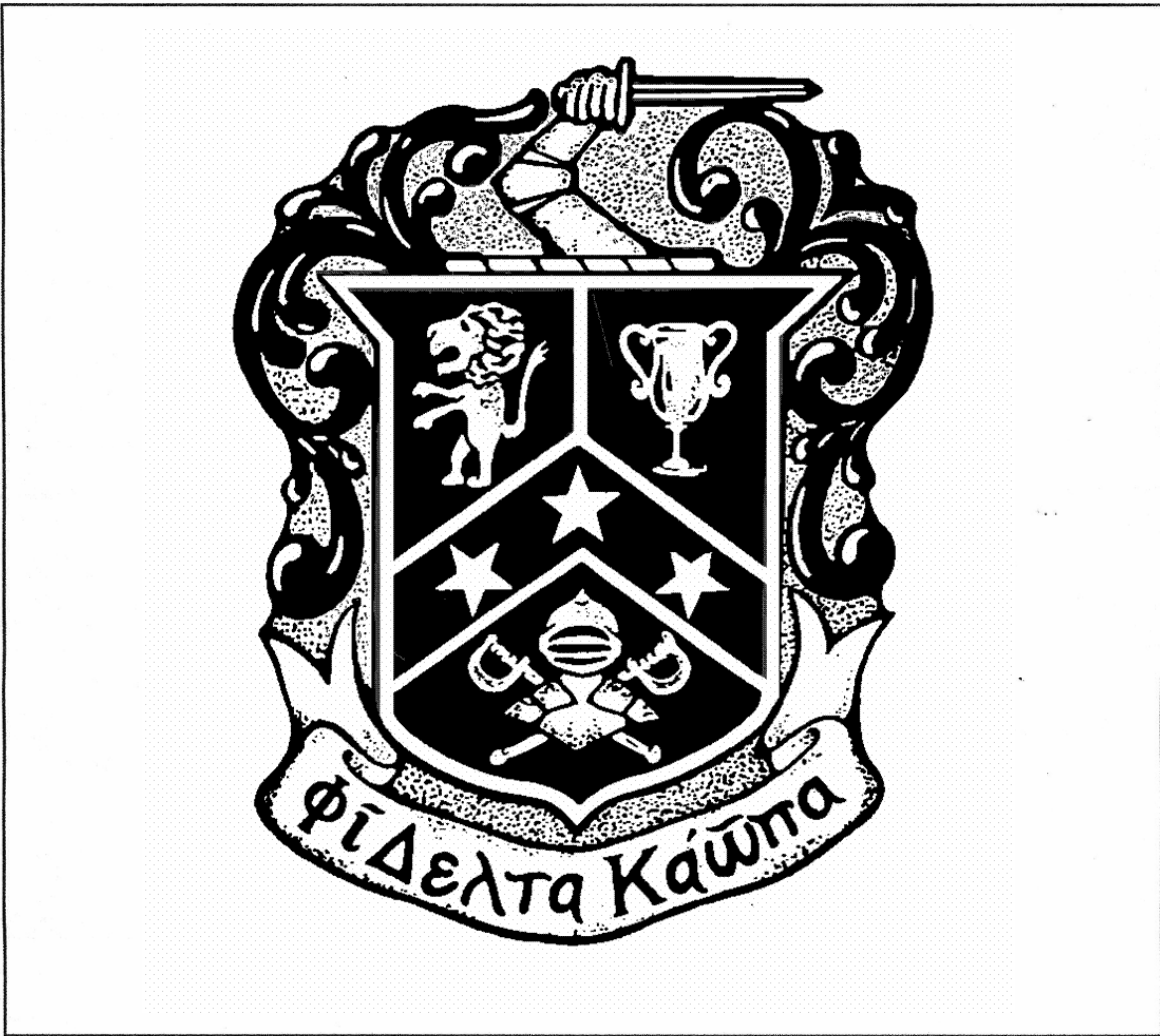

NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

For the past few years I have been writing about The PDK national Museum and Education center. I have spoken about it at every SEC meeting, Convention, and Chapter visit almost since the day I was put on the Historical Committee as a National Officer. What my brother Greg and I had envisioned, and have tried to relate to the membership, is a comprehensive real world and online institution. An institution which seeks to preserve, record, and teach the rich traditions that make up the Phi Delt way of life.



I came to National Convention two years ago with a building plan for the museum's construction at a projected cost of approximately \$12,600. I said at that time my chapter had voted to go ahead and begin the construction and raise the funds through communication to the other chapters and National Officers. That projection only included the construction cost, and none of the interior furnishings and displays needed to present the quality interactive displays that our more than 100 year heritage truly deserves. The physical structure that will house the museum is complete. Now it is time to start putting in the interior displays.

My home chapter, FL Alpha Lambda, has put out the cost of construction, despite only having 38 members, trusting that the membership, fraternity-wide, would surely contribute to see this project completed. Some members and a few chapters have contributed to this cause, yet as of today, we have only received \$4,000 total toward the \$12,600. That represents only 31.7% of the building construction cost collected in two years of fund raising. We must do much better if we are going to try to move forward with the interior displays. Our chapter cannot afford to do this project by ourselves. We simply do not have the funds, and cannot lay out any additional money until we start to receive some donations for its completion.

I said in last month's article that I would provide information in this month's article as to how **you** and **your chapter** can contribute to this effort. The following information is provided to that end.

If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. 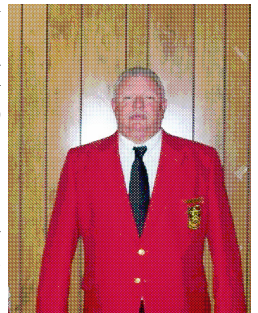
Now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.”

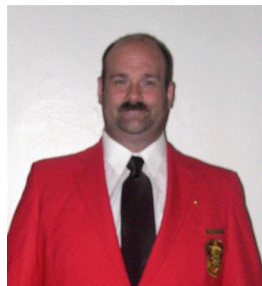
