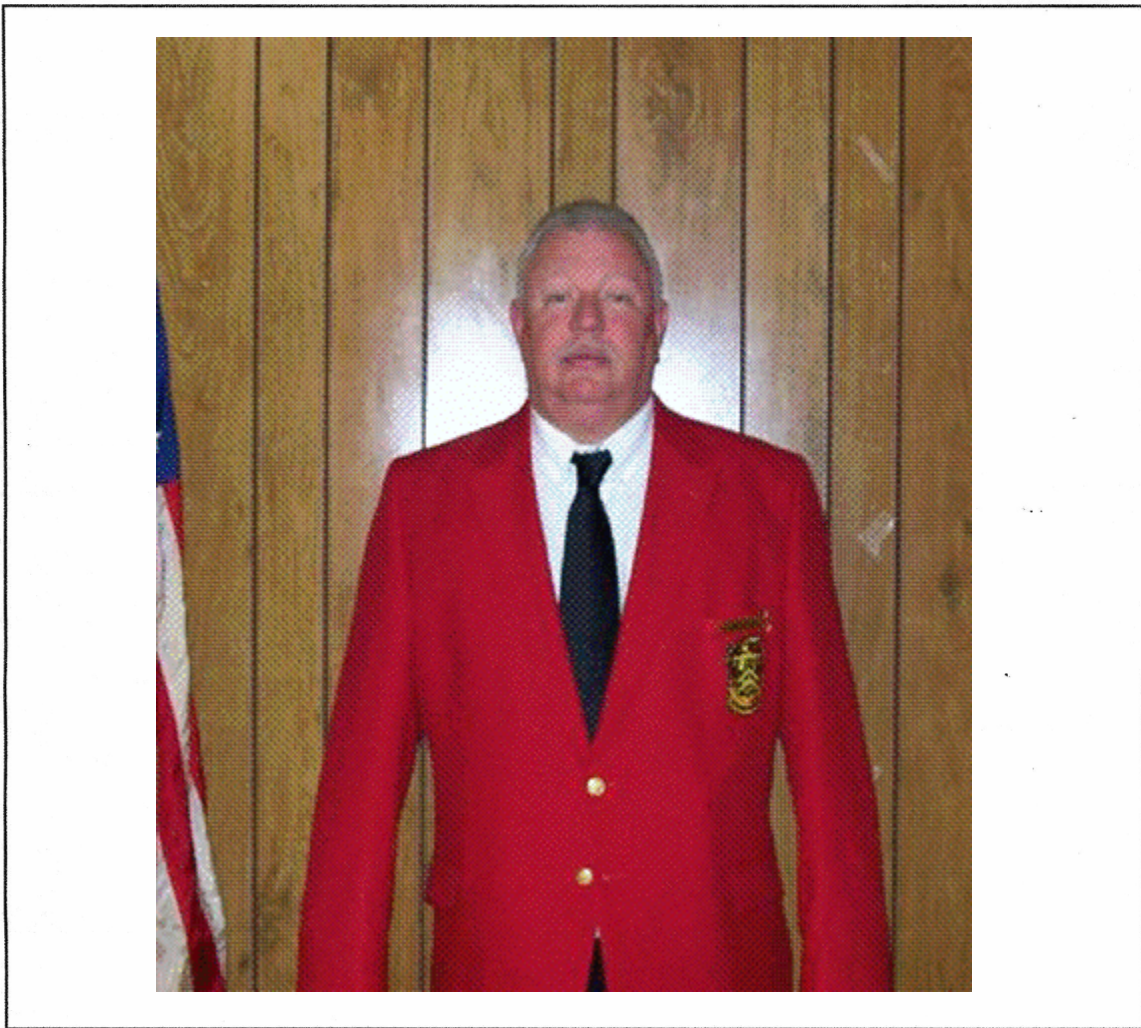

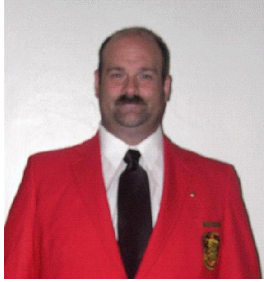
I am looking forward to a great year, being able to travel to every chapter house at least twice, and meeting as many of my Brothers as possible. Until next month, always looking forward,

Hello Brothers, having just returned from the 105th National Convention, I find myself in awe of our founders. This



group of young men started a club, more or less as a diversion to occupy their time. I would venture to say that not one of them had any aspirations of creating a national entity that would endure for over a hundred years. Yet, here we are. Not as strong as we once were, but still here. How is it that we are still here? The "blame" has to lie with our founders and the many leaders who have carried the PDK flag.

The first convention was held in Marion, Indiana in 1906 with four chapters in attendance.
Marion, IN – Alpha Grand
Marion, IN – Gamma
Portland, IN – Delta
Columbus, IN – Beta

This convention was not the grand affair that it has become

today, but the seed had been planted, and did it ever take root. Just four short years after its inception on the steps of Marion High School, PDK was becoming a virus of brotherhood that was spreading quickly through the area.

In that four years, our founders established a constitution, a cast of officers, an agenda for forward thinking, and created rituals that for the most part are the rituals we still use today. The legend of Phi Delta Kappa was drafted by the fourth or fifth meeting of then Iota Tau Kappa and is still heard by every Phi Delt during his initiation. That is simply amazing.

By the mid 1920's, PDK had grown to 76 chapters in 5 states with active membership of 2,500. The brotherhood these seven young men promoted was very infectious.

Today, PDK membership is around 900. Wouldn't it be great if a few of "us" were infected with the zeal of our founders? What could we do in 4 years time? (Especially in this age of instant communication.) Could PDK again flourish and spread? I believe it can.

The following article is a reprint of a submission to the Phi Delta Kappa magazine, published October, 1966 by **Dr. George E. Rinker** (Atlanta chapter), National Sgt. at Arms.

"We don't walk alone"

Have you ever wondered why one chapter flourishes while another goes out of existence? Have you seen your own chapter dwindle until it is only a shadow of its former self? Do you wonder how a chapter which was once so strong can become so weak?

Of course there are many lesser reasons for these conditions, but there is only one real cause. When a preponderance of the brothers within a chapter fail to think "Phi Delta Kappa" on a national level, that chapter is on shaky ground. The national picture is the "glue" which will help hold each individual chapter together when the going gets tough. And if there is one thing which is more important than another in the life of a new brother, it is the idea that he belongs to a national fraternity which is dedicated

to the promotion of better fellowship among men.
