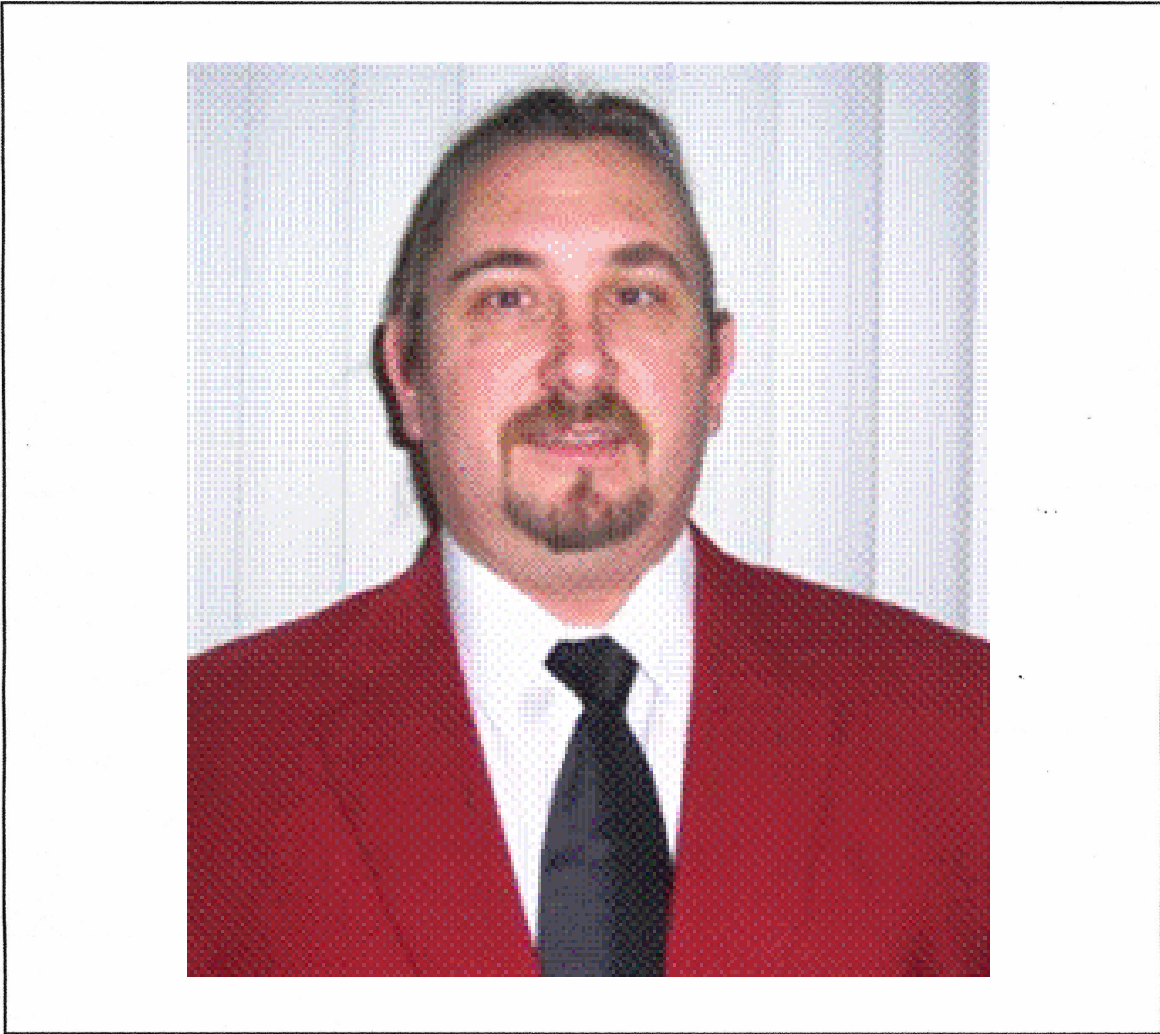

Hello again from the Land of Sunshine. Well, convention is over and a new year has begun for our great Fraternity. And, what a great National convention it was. In my experience, each convention has been a little better than the last. Just when I think that it can't get any better, it always does. This year was no exception. Gamma Theta Danville did an excellent job, and they are to be congratulated. Their membership can be very proud of the results of all their hard work. Congratulations to our four new Emirs, Scott Dull, Greg Sumpter, Lloyd "Butch" Marshall, and Jim Myers. Congratulations to our new National Sweetheart, Stephanie Smurr, and congratulations to Doug Leach for being named Chapter President of the Year. The green jacket looks good on you, Doug.



It's hard to believe that it is my time in the top chair already. It seems like just a short time ago, Devin Reid and I were running for our first national office. I want to thank Devin for doing a great job as our president this past year. It was no small task to continue to grow this fraternity during these tough economic times. I also want to thank all of our National Officers for stepping up and continuing to do the work necessary to keep this fraternal brotherhood alive and moving forward. It is especially important to continue to advance this fraternity forward, while preserving its storied history for the generations to come. It became especially clear during this very productive convention that our membership wants to see progress on both of those items. With that in mind, I will lay out what our plans are for this year to make progress in both directions.

First, our membership is demanding better and more modern ways to communicate with both the SEC, and each other. To accomplish that, we are working on the National Phi Delta Kappa website. We intend to make it a user-friendly place where our members can get current news, chapter information, and calendars, so the membership can know what is going on in all the chapters at the click of a mouse. It will also be a place where we can set up forums where members can discuss important issues, and share ideas with each other to make all of our chapters better. We will be able to share pictures and video from our national and local fraternity events. And, it will also serve as an arm of the PDK National Museum and Education Center. We will put up past magazines, pictures of historical items, and it will be a place to get educational information, for example: brotherhood guides, membership drive materials, useful forms, etc. Our Goal is to have the website fully operational within a year. In the meantime, a grass roots effort has already begun with a group of members and their families who have banded together on Facebook.com. I will provide the information necessary to join the Facebook group in my next article.

Finally, with the construction end of the Museum completed, it is time to fill the museum with historical items and set up the displays, as well as the computer station and archives for the Education Center. To that end, I will be asking each chapter to donate one special item to the museum that will represent your chapter, along with a brief history of the item, and an explanation as to why the item represents that chapter. These items will be displayed prominently in the Current Chapters section of the museum. As far as the money needed to complete this historic effort, we are still way short of our fundraising goal to finish the project. Thus far Florida Alpha Lambda has committed about \$12,000.00 and received only \$4,300.00. It is my sincere hope that all of the chapters will make an urgent and concerted effort to raise, and contribute, as much funding as possible quickly, so we can continue to move forward with our plans. We have created a couple of fundraising avenues online. One website offers dozens of PDK items such as t-shirts, coffee cups, etc., from which the profits will be directed to the Historical fund. The other is a secure, encrypted site, where members can donate directly to the fund with a credit card online. I will provide additional information about both of these websites in my next article. It is our intention to hold the Grand Opening of the PDK National Museum and Education Center during National Convention next July.

As you can see, this is a very aggressive agenda, and it will take the efforts of all of us to see it completed. So with one eye on the future, and one eye on the past, we need to pull together to see all of this completed this year. I know we can accomplish this and am counting on all of you to help us see it through. I, and the entire SEC, look forward to serving you this year. Let's make it one we will talk about for years to come. As always, I am proud to be a Phi Delt!

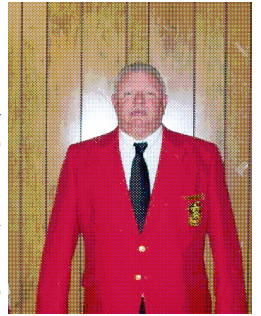
