

NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Opinions

Everyone has an opinion, some educated, some emotional and some a little off the deep end – although they would be quick to take offense at that characterization. I try to keep in mind that their opinion is important to them and just as well meaning as mine. I try not to stand in judgment of the beliefs of others, but listen carefully to the reasons for their opinion. I may not agree with their conclusions, but I attempt to consider that I might be wrong.

If I disagree with your conclusion, I will tell you to your face, but my goal is to do this in a respectful way and **not** get into emotional and demeaning rhetoric. Too many times a brother's disagreement deteriorates into what I often refer to as a pissing contest. Insults are exchanged and the disagreement turns into a one-ups-man-ship contest. Bad feelings develop and clandestine accusations evolve into recruiting others to support their point of view and drive a stake into that vampire's heart.

The real issue is not about who is ultimately going to be determined right (the smart one) but about what is the best course of action for the fraternity. We should all work toward the success of the final decision, whoever made it. In that way, Phi Delta Kappa will always win even when adjustments to that decision must be made.

Brotherhood is about supporting each other in as much as a brother's issue is supportable. It is about defending a brother's good name against the degradation of others, even if the accusations appear to you to be somewhat warranted. When we find there is some truth to the charges being made, we should try to encourage the brother to look at his antagonist's point of view, and see if there is an ounce of factual evidence to support it, maybe something he has overlooked. This can be a difficult goal to achieve without sounding superior and demeaning. Trust your instincts as you talk to him, but let him feel your support for his efforts to discover the truth even if he has stubbed his toe along the way. Be quick to agree with him about those points you feel he is right about, and see if you can get him to concede that he may have inadvertently jumped to a conclusion that is unfounded. Encourage him to make amends with his accuser, and look for common ground. Our ultimate goal is to reach an amenable and agreeable solution.

It is never too late to apologize to a brother for speaking badly about him without considering his feelings. I have done this myself and suffered the regret of alienating him and damaging our friendship. Words spoken-in-hast often have a lingering aftertaste that is difficult to overcome. I have to ask myself, "Was the feeling of superiority I felt briefly worth the agitation I caused my brother?" All I can do now is apologize to him, without "but ifs" and hope he forgives my idiocy.

Opinions are, after all, **only** "opinions." Don't lose your credibility with the fraternity by hitting a brother over the head – hug him instead and gain his respect and your own self-respect as well.




Congrats to Beta Eta's Jeff Woolf on being elected Chapter President of the Year. Jeff really worked hard and is very deserving of this honor.
