



This time of year is when we do our most charitable events. We raise money for Equiventure Therapeutic Riding by having a band or two host an event in the chapter house. We hit the crowd up for donations then match the money collected dollar for dollar up to \$500. The bands donate their musical talents and play for free through our "house" PA (thank you Brother Mike Leazenby). Last year was the first year that the crowd exceeded the \$500 goal. The first weekend in December also takes our brothers to two intersections in the city of Kokomo. We stand out in the intersections with our We Care buckets in hand. We do this in whatever weather the good Lord brings us that weekend. The goal is to collect loose change, bills and checks for We Care. The amount of money we collect for We Care is typically over \$10,000. This is accomplished over a few hours on Friday night, most of the daylight hours on Saturday and a few more hours on Sunday. The chapter house is typically filled with plenty of food, brothers and their sweethearts along with other family members. Our sweethearts are in charge of counting all the bills and cleaning the change.

This to me is one of my favorite weekends of the year. The money collected is to help insure that the less fortunate children of Kokomo and Howard County can have a few Christmas presents to open. The local cable company has a dedicated channel for the auction that starts on Friday night and runs continuously through Sunday. This channel is running the whole time someone is in the chapter house. People from the area donate items to We Care for the auction. On Sunday evening the totals are presented by many local entities. The Beta Nu Phi Delts are one of the last groups to present our collection total. Remember we almost always collect over \$10,000 for We Care. The loud cheers from the studio audience can be totally overwhelming. Knowing that I could help some child I don't even know, to have a blessed Christmas makes me swell up with joy and pride.

PNP, Emir and as true of a Phi Delt that you will ever meet Brother Jim Myers spearheads our chapter's involvement in We Care. He calls brothers and gets them to commit to a time slot to work the intersections. He makes several pots of some of the best chili that you will ever put in your mouth for us "workers". Jim donates a huge amount of hours to We Care. He does this on his own volition and expects nothing in return for his efforts. I am sure he does it because it makes him happy. Beta Nu benefits in the eyes of the community because of Jim's tireless efforts. Thank you brother! (I am wiping a tear from my eye, sorry for the delay.)

The other main charity we do is for the Moose Carden Kids Fishing Clinic. Our part in this wonderful charity is to raise money for equipment so the kids can fish. We use the chapter house to host a party with bands, comedians, magicians, whatever we can dig up to entertain the crowd to help the kids out. Brother Craig Carter is the main Phi Delt to get this event up and running. Craig gets door prizes from all over the central Indiana area. There is a cost to attend the fundraiser but that ticket gets you a chance at the door prizes. The sales receipt that Craig shows off after he and the other boat captains do their shopping is HUGE. I bet one year is was over 10 feet in

length. The Kid's Fishing Clinic has received a National Award for their efforts. Pretty darn impressive wouldn't you say?
